### A Brief History of the College

St. Paul's College, Kalamassery is a prestigious Arts and Science college in the Ernakulam district of Kerala, affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam and recognized by the University Grants Commission. The College functions under the Archdiocese of Verapoly, a pioneering entity in the field of education.

The College was founded by the visionary Rev. Dr Joseph Attipetty, the late Archbishop of Verapoly, to commemorate the historic visit of His Holiness Pope Paul VI to India in December 1964. The foundation stone of the college was blessed by His Holiness on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 1964 and was solemnly laid by Dr Samuel Mathai, the then Vice-Chancellor of the University of Kerala in the presence of Dr. Joseph Attipetty on 13<sup>th</sup> February 1965. It was out of filial devotion to His Holiness, the Pope, that the College was named after St. Paul, his heavenly patron.

The College made a humble beginning on 13<sup>th</sup> July 1965, offering two year Pre-Degree courses. The first degree course was introduced in the year 1978 and over the years, other degree courses, were added. St. Paul's College became a first grade college with the introduction of a Post Graduate course in the year 1982. To keep up with the changing times, the institution was made co-educational in 1983. Today, the College is a force to reckon with in the education scenario in Kerala - with sixteen undergraduate courses, six post graduate courses and a research centre.

The College received the first NAAC accreditation grade in the year 2004 and the next in 2010. A phenomenal change in the academic and infrastructural domains fetched the college an 'A' grade in the third cycle of re-accreditation by NAAC in 2016. The college improved the NAAC score and maintained the grade in the fourth cycle of re-accreditation in 2021. The College has also been certified by ISO 9001:2015 in 2017 for providing educational services. St. Paul's College has made immense strides into the twenty first century, but will not rest on its laurels, for it will always seek to grow and march ahead.

# Location of the College

St.Paul's College is strategically located in Kalamassery, the industrial heartland of Ernakulam. Its neighbourhood is virtually an educational hub with several educational institutions of great reputation. It is easily accessible from both Kochi city and from Aluva by road, faces the Seaport - Airport Road, is a stone's throw away from two metro stations and a mere 12 kilometers away from the Cochin International Airport.

### i. St. Paul's Digital Library

A fully automated modern Digital Library has undeniably become the fountainhead of learning activities and information sharing system globally. St. Paul's College Library is a reservoir of knowledge in diverse areas such as Social Sciences, Humanities and Sciences. The two-storied building has a carpet area of about 11,000 sq. ft. The Library is fully automated using "KOHA" software with more than 34,000 volumes of text books and reference books. A total of 80 print periodicals including journals and magazines are subscribed in the library. Digital collections include DVDs and CD-ROMs. Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) enables the members to search for, reserve or check the status of any book in the library. St. Paul's College digital library has attained the position of a First Grade Library. Digital Library uses D Space software which serves as a platform for preserving digital content. Fully networked 35 computer stations with high speed internet facility and Wi-Fi facility are also provided in the library. Ejournals can be accessed from the Digital Library through the NLIST programme of INFLIBNET. The College Library was established in 1965 at the very inception of the institution and it was digitalised in 2014. Apart from having a number of rare and precious books in different subjects, it has a large reference section containing reference books on various languages and subjects, including the Britannica, Americana and Catholic Encyclopedia. The library also subscribes to a number of national and international journals, reviews and magazines in addition to all leading periodicals, magazines and newspapers. Students can access the library between 8.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. on all working days.

### **Library Rules**

- 1. All members of the staff and students are entitled to use the library for consultation and for taking books on loan.
- 2. The library functions on all working days from  $8.00\,a.m$  to  $4.30\,p.m.$
- 3. Each student is given two borrower's tickets bearing his/her name, class number etc.
- 4. Reference books are not given on loan.
- 5. A student who fails to return a book on the day on which it falls due shall be fined Rs.1 for each day the book is detained beyond that date.
- 6. A student who damages a book shall be fined in proportion to the damage.
- 7. If a book is lost by any borrower, he/she must replace it by the latest edition within the time fixed by the Librarian.
- 8. Members are not allowed to sub-lend the books of the library. Breach of this rule will lead to loss of membership.



INFormation and LIBrary NETwork (INFLIBNET) was initiated by the UGC in April 1991. Inflibnet can be defined as a computer communication network of libraries and information centres of universities, institutions of national importance, Research and Development Institutions, bibliographical information centres, etc. thereby improving the capability in information handling and services. All students at St. Paul's College get the rare opportunity of getting connected to the Inflibnet.



Virtual Lab is an initiative of the Ministry of Human Resource Department under the National Mission on Education through ICT. The project aims to provide remote-access to Laboratories in various disciplines of science and engineering for students at all levels from under-graduate to research. It also aims to share costly equipment and resources, various tools for learning, including additional web-resources, video-lectures, animated demonstrations and self evaluation. St. Paul's College, Kalamassery is a nodal centre of Virtual lab facility under Amrita University, Kochi. In 2015 St. Paul's college was awarded National level fourth position in the usage of virtual lab facility.



Mentoring offers one to one relationship between mentor (Teacher) and mentee (Students). It is an activity of supporting and advising students to excel in their studies and life. Quality mentoring greatly enhances students' chances for success. In this program 15 to 20 students are assigned to a mentor. Mentors frequently interact with students and their parents, understand the strength, weakness and potentials of the students and support them to lead good academic, professional and personal life.

## v. Health Centre

St. Paul's College has a health centre that is designed to ensure good health and wellness of its students. The centre is open from 9.30 am to 12.30 pm on every first and third Wednesdays to all students, teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. A General Physician of Lourdes Hospital offers consultation to the needy students. The medicines prescribed by the doctor are distributed to the students with the help of the fund raised by PTA.

## vi Counselling Cell

The Counselling Cell of St. Paul's College Kalamassery aims at helping students to reach their highest academic and personal potential. This may involve helping with personal, learning and

career concerns and promoting success and wellness among them. The Counselling cell provides a confidential atmosphere in which the students can explore any topic or situation and discuss any concerns they may have. The students are helped to work through their problems, to develop self awareness and to overcome problems. The counselling cell offers free counselling to students on individual or group basis on every Monday from 9.30 to 12.30 PM.

## vii Physical Education

St. Paul's College is equipped with many outdoor and indoor games facilities for the students irrespective of gender difference to take part both in individual and group activities. This infrastructure of the institution provides conducive atmosphere to all students to excel in their respective sports skills by offering them with basketball court, volleyball court, football ground cum cricket field of 400 Mts. standard track with 8 lanes. The college also possesses ample space for indoor games including badminton, table tennis, carroms and chess.

### 1. Athletics Ground

The college athletics ground, since 1989 is the focal point for recreation and fitness. It consist of 400Mts., 8 lane grass track which has proudly hosted National/State/University level athletic meets.

### 2. Celebrity Cricket Stadium

Celebrity Cricket Stadium offers one of the finest cricketing facilities in the state of Kerala. It includes five international standard turf pitches, three turf practice wickets and a concrete practice pitch. The Cricket court hosts a range of cricketing programs for the National, State, District, University and community level competitions. It is the practice site for many Indian cricket celebrities and the breeding sports hub for many national level sportsmen.

#### 3. Football Stadium

Our Football field is one of the best outdoor facilities in the state. Boasting a beautifully manicured natural grass playing surface, the facility serves as home to the college's football team. The playing field itself is 200 Mts. long and 150 Mts. wide.

### 4. Volleyball Court

The Volleyball court is open to all students who show genuine interest in the game. Physical Education classes and recreational classes are conducted in the area on a daily basis.

#### 5. Indoor Court

The renovated Paulian Indoor Court cum Auditorium features a pleasant arena for Shuttle Badminton, Table Tennis, Yoga, Taekwondo, Boxing, and Aerobic training. It can spaciously accommodate more than 1200 students.

To ensure transparency of the evaluation process, the internal assessment marks awarded to the students in each course in a semester shall be published on the notice board at least one week before the commencement of external examination. There shall not be any chance for improvement for internal mark.

The course teacher and the faculty advisor shall maintain the academic record of each student registered for the course which shall be forwarded to the University through the college principal and a copy should be kept in the college for at least two years for verification.

External Evaluation: The external Examination in theory courses is to be conducted by the University with question papers set by external experts. The answers must be written in English except those for the Faculty of languages. The evaluation of the answer scripts shall be done by examiners based on a well-defined scheme of valuation given by the question paper setters. The external evaluation shall be done immediately after the examination preferably through Centralized Valuation.

Photocopies of the answer scripts of the external examination shall be made available to the students for scrutiny on request and revaluation/scrutiny of answer scripts shall be done as per the existing rules prevailing in the University.

The question paper should be strictly on the basis of model question paper set by BOS and there shall be a combined meeting of the question paper setters for scrutiny and finalisation of question paper. Each set of question should be accompanied by its scheme of valuation.

## STUDENT LIFE

### i. COLLEGE UNION

The College Union is intended to promote the social and cultural life of students and to train them in the rights and duties of citizenship. It also helps in the development of their personalities and skills. All students of the college are members of the college union. The various office bearers are elected by the students. The office bearers include: the 1) Chairman 2) Vice Chairman 3) General Secretary 4) University Union Councillors 5) Arts club Secretary 6) Magazine Editor 7) Lady Representatives. The College Union promotes many cultural activities. It safeguards the rights of the students and supervises the yearly publication of the college magazine. The College Union strives to attain the objectives mentioned in Rules of General Discipline.

### ii. NCC

### (Senior boys & Senior girls division)

NCC aims to provide service training to the University students. It also helps in the development of personality, character and leadership. 'Unity & Discipline' is the motto of National Cadet Corps. The students joining the NCC get opportunity to take part in various camps, mountaineering, etc. Weightage of marks is given for those students who attend the NCC parades.

The members of the NCC are eligible to appear for 'B' certificate & 'C' certificate examinations. Those who obtain 'C' certificate and have secured a degree can appear for direct commission in the SSB and Defence Force without appearing for UPSC Examinations.

### iii. NSS

The NSS Unit aims at serving the community along with education. It is intended to make the students conscious of the importance of being useful to the society. Membership to NSS is open to boys & girls. The volunteers are expected to work for the unit for a minimum 120 hours a year. The volunteers of NSS get weightage marks for admission to various courses of study and grace marks in the University examinations.

### iv. College Magazine

Students, who like to develop a critical and creative approach to life, involve in studies and activities linked to broader social issues and struggles with a view to become a constructive force within the college and outside, are encouraged to join the AICUF unit, irrespective of their religions.

### xiv. Jesus Youth

Jesus Youth is an International Catholic Youth Movement organized by the Roman Catholic church in the mid-1970s to foster catholic values and spirituality among the Catholic students. The movement invites its youth to follow a lifestyle based on the life of Jesus Christ to become the light of the world. ENCON CLUB is a purely voluntary non profit group activity of students aimed at practising energy conservation and environmental protection. This gives a platform for the members to acquire process and share knowledge on the subject. The main objective of the club is to drive home the message of energy conservation and environmental protection in the minds of students by planning and organizing regular activities.

### xvii. Anti-Drug / Anti-Tobacco Club

The Anti-drug Club of the college functions with the aim of ensuring a drug free campus and building up a healthy student environment. ### ii. Fee Regulations

- 1. Tuition fees will be collected either in lump at the beginning of the year or in instalments at the beginning of each term or semester as the case may be.
- 2. Fine for late payment of tuition fees. Within 10 days from due date ₹5 & after 10 days ₹10.
- 3. Fee must be paid on the dates fixed in the Calendar for the purpose.

- 4. If the fees and fine of an instalment are not paid before the last date given for payment of that instalment, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following the expiry of the period and the student will not get the benefit of attendance from the date of removal from the rolls of the college. If the student is to be readmitted he/she has to apply for the special permission of the Principal and also has to remit all the arrears of fees with fine. ₹ 50 as Re-admission fee will be levied in such cases of re-admission. The readmitted students will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of readmission.
- 5. The last opportunity for the payment of an instalment of fee mentioned above is designed as the last working day previous to the due date of the succeeding instalment. But in the case of the last instalment, ie., the fee due for February, the last opportunity is fixed as the 5<sup>th</sup> March, if the 5<sup>th</sup> of March happens to be a holiday, then the last working day previous to such date will be considered as the last opportunity (A student will be admitted to a new term only if he clears the dues of the previous term).
- 6. Every student is liable to pay the prescribed fee for the whole term during part of which his/her name is on the rolls of the College.
- 7. Each instalment of fees shall be paid on the dates notified in the Calendar. All cash transactions will be closed at 2 p.m. everyday.
- 8. A receipt signed by the Accountant shall be granted for every payment made, which the student shall preserve and produce whenever required by the Principal.
- 9. Mistakes if any, in the receipts issued for payments made should be pointed out then and there and should be got corrected on the spot. Complaints made later will not be entertained.

### iii. Refund of Fees

Refund of fees including special fees once remitted will not be granted to those students who had already paid the tuition and other special fees for one particular course in an Arts & Science College or Sanskrit College and who joins another professional or Technical College or Institutions offering a different course of instruction and not coming under the Director of Collegiate Education or under the Scheme of Direct Payment.

In respect of the Private Arts & Science Colleges coming under the Direct Payment system, the respective Zonal Deputy Directors of Collegiate Education are empowered to sanction refund of fees. Wherever the term 'fees' is mentioned, it means "Tuition fees" alone. If any eligible Backward Community students had paid their fees at the time of joining the College and such fees had been remitted into the treasury, the amount of fees so paid will be got reimbursed by the Harijan Welfare Department.

### iv. Issue of Certificates

- 1. Three day notice is required for the issue of certificates.
- 2. Certificates will be issued only after the payment of all dues to the College.
- 3. Student Identity Card is a prerequisite for receiving any certificates or caution deposit
- Conduct Certificate is a document which the student has to earn. It will not be issued as a 4. matter of course.
- No Transfer Certificate will be issued to those who owe dues to the College. No fee will be 5. levied from those who apply for T.C. within one year of leaving the College. After one year a fee of Rs. 55 will be charged from the applicants. A fee of 100 will be levied on those who apply for duplicate copies of the T.C. Every student should take his/her T.C. at the end of his/her course and produce it when he/she is admitted to the next course.
- Application for certificate by post should be addressed to the "Principal, St. Paul's College, Kalamassery, HMT Colony P.O., 683503". No certificate will be sent by post unless a sufficiently stamped, self addressed envelope accompanies the application.

# COLLEGE RULES & REGULATIONS

Students are hereby instructed to strictly follow the rules and regulations of the St. Paul's College. One is not expected to plead that one is not aware of the existence of such rules. Ignorance of rules is no excuse. It is the duty of every student to abide by the rules and regulations. Violation of the rules will result in disciplinary action against the offenders and imposition of punishment including dismissal.

### A. Identity Cards

- All students admitted to the college shall compulsorily wear their Identity Cards whenever they are present in the college campus and produce it on demand by the authorities or persons authorised to do that.
- 2. All services like payments, issue of certificates, mark lists etc., will be made only on production of the Identity Card.
- 3. The Identity Card shall be surrendered to the office at the time of claiming the refund of caution deposit or issuing of Transfer Certificate/Qualifying Certificate, whichever is earlier.

### B. Character and Conduct

- 1. Students shall greet all the staff members on the occasion of their first meeting with them during the day.
- 2. College timing is from **8.30** am to **3.30** pm. Students should be present in the classrooms in the prescribed time. Students should be seated in their respective class rooms before the teaching hour commences and should not leave the classes except during intervals.
- 3. Students should be seated in their respective class rooms 5 minute before the class begins. After the second bell, during the time of the College Anthem, all should keep standing in perfect silence and reverence.
- 4. When a student wants to enter or leave the classroom while the class is on, he/she shall do so only after getting the permission of the concerned teacher.
- 5. During the absence of the teacher and while moving from one class to another, students are expected to keep silence.
- 6. Students shall not loiter/wander in the verandahs or college premises during working hours for any reasons whatsoever.

- 7. Students are advised to use the College Library during free periods and strict silence should be maintained in the College Library.
- 8. Students shall not enter any class rooms other than those allotted to them.
- 9. No indecent representation shall be made by any student towards any other student in words, letters and gestures or by any other means.
- 10. Conduct Certificate will not be issued on merely completion of academic programme (Course). It has to be earned by the student's good conduct and behavior. The decision of the Principal shall be final regarding this matter.

### C. Attendance and Leave

- 1. Students should be regular and punctual in attending classes. A working day is divided into five periods.
- 2. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each hour by the teacher engaging the class.
- 3. Any leave must be obtained in advance from the HoD/ Principal in writing in the prescribed leave form. No leave will be granted unless the Principal is satisfied with the reason stated. If a student is not able to submit the leave in advance, then they should submit the leave form on the succeeding working day.
- 4. A student abstaining from classes without proper intimation of leave for more than ten consecutive working days will have his/her name removed from the rolls.
- 5. Student shall not take leave of absence unless it is absolutely necessary. Irregularity in attendance may result in the loss of term days, which will end in the loss of a year.
- 6. Application for leave of absence should be submitted in the prescribed form to the HoD through the tutor concerned well in advance. Bona fide applications will be positively considered subject to regulations and will be forwarded to Controller of Examinations (CoE).
- 7. Applying for leave of absence does not imply that the leave will be granted.
- 8. In the case of medical leave, the leave letter should be submitted along with the medical certificate issued by a registered medical practitioner, within a week from the commencement of medical leave to another, students are expected to keep silence.
- 9. Leave for Academic/ Sports/ Arts/ NCC/ NSS/ activities will be granted only to those students who have availed prior sanction from the Principal through the proper channel duly recommended by the concerned authority for representing the College or University or higher levels for various seminars / workshops / camps / programs and such other extracurricular activities within or outside the campus. Student should submit a copy of leave sanction order by the Principal along with the proof of participation in the event to the Controller of Examination's office not later than one week after the event.

- 10. If one teaching hour is missed it is equal to missing half a day's attendance. i.e. If a student misses any one teaching hour in first three periods, student will miss half a day's attendance. If a student misses any one teaching hour in fourth or fifth period, student will miss half a day's attendance. If a student misses one teaching hour in first to third period and in fourth or fifth, the student will be considered as for the full day absent.
- 11. The certificate of attendance and progress required for admission to the end semester examination will in no case be granted unless:
  - a. The student has secured attendance of not less than 75% of the total number of working in the semester.
  - b. The Principal considers that the student's progress and conduct have been satisfactory.
- 12. Student should get a minimum of 75% of the attendance in a semester to appear for end semester examinations.
- 13. Candidates between 65% to 75% other than the allowed leave can apply for condonation of shortage to the Principal only if the absence is on medical ground or reasons beyond the control of the student. Necessary Medical Certificate is to be attached along with the application form. Condonation of shortage of attendance can only be availed once for a two year programme and twice for a three year programme. Candidates less than 65% is not eligible for condonation.
- 14. No student is expected to approach the Principal or the Vice Principals/CoE/ College office in person for enquiry on attendance. In case of any doubts or grievances, they may approach the Tutor or HoD.

### D. Mobile Phones (High Court of Kerala [WP(c)23377/09)

- 1. The use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the college campus on the basis of the orders issued by varoius authorities including the Honourable High Court of Kerala [WP(c)23377/09]. Offenders will be levied with fine and the mobile phone will be confiscated. A surprise inspection Squad is formed to implement the rule.
- 2. Breach of the law invites disciplinary action along with fine as follows.
  - a. If caught for the first time simple fine of Rs. 500/-
  - b. If caught for the second time, a fine of Rs. 1000/- will be fined and the Mobile set will be confiscated for three months and SIM Card will be returned.
  - c. If caught for a third time mobile set will be confiscated permanently and necessary disciplinary action will also be initiated.

### E. Dress Code

Students should wear modest and decent dress.

### F. Visitors

- 1. Students shall not bring any outsiders except the parent/guardian to the college premises for any purpose whatsoever without the permission of the Principal.
- 2. Outsiders are not permitted to meet any of the staff or students in the college campus without the permission of the Principal.
- 3. Other than staff members, present students and permitted personals, no one is allowed to enter the class rooms, laboratories and hostel in any case.

### G. Political/Organisational Activities

Court Verdict Banning political activities in the College campuses

Judgement No. WA-535/2003 dated 26-05-2003

by the Honourable High Court of Kerala

- 1. Political activities are strictly prohibited in and around the college campus.
- 2. Students are strictly prohibited from taking part or participating in any agitation, demonstration, strike, dharna, gherao and such activities which will disturb the classes or cause threat to the peaceful atmosphere of the College campus.
- 3. Students shall not bring or fix flags, placards, leaflets, pamphlets, notice boards, banners, posters or any publicity material of any political parties or any organizations in and around the campus. Any political campaigning through social media is strictly prohibited. Its violation will lead to cancellation of candidature and will initiate disciplinary actions.
- 4. No political /organisational activities shall be permitted in the campus except those official activities which are specifically permitted or sponsored by the college authorities.
- 5. It is forbidden to organize or attend meetings other than the official ones which are specifically permitted by the college authorities.

All expressions or activities which are immoral, anti-social, communal and anti-national are strictly prohibited in the College campus.

### H. Ragging: A Serious Criminal Offence

Students shall not indulge in ragging or in any other activities causing harassment or difficulties to the fellow students in the college. Any student involving in ragging activities will have to face penal proceedings in accordance with the provisions in the Ragging Prohibition Act of the Govt. of Kerala.

### **Prevention of Ragging in Institutions**

As per the decision of the supreme court of INDIA ragging is strictly prohibited

### What is considered as ragging?

As per the UGC Regulations, 2009 and its continuous modifications, 'Ragging' constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- ii. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- iii. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- iv. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- v. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- vi. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- vii. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- viii. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- ix. Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.

Ragging is prohibited inside or outside the Educational Institution. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates ragging within, or outside the Educational Institution shall on conviction will be punished.

All the students are strictly warned against getting involved into such an unbailable crime and all are requested to desist from such activities for not endangering their future. Collection of contribution in any form or demanding anything in kind from any students is totally banned.

### **KERALA RAGGING PROHIBITION ACT 1998**

8. **കുറ്റം ചെയ്യാൻ പ്രേരിപ്പിക്കുന്നതായി കരുതാവുന്നത്**: വിദ്യാഭ്യാസസ്ഥാപനത്തിന്റെ മേധാവി 6-ാം വകുപ്പിൽ പറയപ്പെടുന്ന രീതിയിൽ റാഗിംങ്ങിനെക്കുറിച്ചുള്ള ഒരു പരാതി മേൽ നടപടിയെടുക്കാതിരിക്കുകയോ അഥവാ നടപടി എടുക്കാൻ അനാസ്ഥ കാണിക്കു കയോ ചെയ്യുകയാണെങ്കിൽ അങ്ങനെയുള്ള വ്യക്തി റാഗിംങ്ങ് എന്ന കുറ്റം ചെയ്യാൻ പ്രേരിപ്പിച്ചതായി കരുതപ്പെടേണ്ടതും കുറ്റസ്ഥാപനത്തിനുമേൽ 4-ാം വകുപ്പിൽ വ്യവസ്ഥ ചെയ്തിട്ടുള്ള പ്രകാരം ശിക്ഷിക്കപ്പെടേണ്ടതുമാണ്.

### I. General Rules

- 1. Students are not permitted to go out of the campus during class hours without exit slip. In case of emergency the exit slip will be issued by the Class Tutor.
- 2. Smoking and consumption of alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited in the campus. Students shall not use or bring tobacco or its products, alcohol, intoxicating drinks or narcotic substances to the college. Any violation will lead to disciplinary action.
- Any student who is found under consumption of Alcohol or Drugs will be suspended with immediate effect and further disciplinary actions will be initiated. If found guilty student will be dismissed.
- 4. Students shall not go on tour, picnic, excursion and study tour without the prior sanction and approval of the Principal.
- 5. Non academic activities are allowed only after the academic hours.
- 6. Prior written permission of the Principal is necessary for organizing any meetings, entertainment programmes, functions in the college; and for distributing notice or putting up any notice in the notice board.
- 7. Prior sanction should be obtained from the management for using halls, class rooms or any other infrastructure for meeting, entertainment programs, functions in the college.
- 8. Students shall not write or make any marks or stick posters in the walls or any part of the college property.
- 9. Students shall not cause any loss or damage to the college property. Intentional causing of loss or damage will be considered a serious misconduct. Disciplinary action will be initiated against the offenders and they will be liable for recovery of the loss. The loss or damage thus caused to the college articles will be made good by realizing double the value of loss or damage from the student/s concerned. Unintentional causing of loss or damage will result in the recovery of loss or damages from the offenders.
- 10. As per the Higher Education Department directives, cinematic dances and fashion shows are not permitted in the campus.

- 11. Congregating at the entrance of the college gate and sitting in the portico and the steps of the staircase are to be avoided.
- 12. Student vehicles will be allowed only up to the designated parking area. Entry beyond that point is strictly prohibited. Entry of vehicles is banned in the notified areas of the College Campus. Breach of law invites legal and disciplinary action.
- 13. Students are prohibited from defaming the college, college authorities, staff or students through any media (online/social/ printed/verbal etc.). Disciplinary action will be taken against those students who disobey this rule.
- 14. Any student who is persistently insolent or insubordinate or willfully and repeatedly commits mischief or is guilty of fraud or malpractice or who in the opinion of the Principal is likely to have an unwholesome influence on his fellow students or tarnish the reputation of the institution shall be removed from the rolls. The removal shall be either temporary or permanent subject to the gravity of the misconduct.
- 15. In case any student has any grievance or complaint they shall approach the tutor first. On receipt of the complaint, the matter will be discussed in the department level grievance redressal committee and necessary action may be taken. In cases where the matter is not concluded in 1<sup>st</sup> level the same may be forwarded to the College level grievance redressal committee headed by the principal will take the appropriate decision. Governing Council will be the appeal authority and the decision of the Governing Council shall be final on all such matters.
- 16. In the interest of the institution and for the sake of discipline, the Principal is entitled to refuse admission to any applicant, to suspend, to dismiss or take any other punitive action on any student for his/her misconduct.
- 17. The Governing Council shall be the final authority in the interpretation of the College rules. Matters not covered by these rules are left to the discretion of the Governing Council. And decision of Governing Council shall be final and binding.
- 18. Students who posses a criminal background/have a police case initiated against them are not eligible for admissions. If the same is brought to light post admissions, the students will be expelled without further notice.
- 19. If a student is found using the ID card of another student, both will be summarily be fined a sum of ₹ 2000/- and further disciplinary action may be initiated against them.

### J. Misconduct and Disciplinary Actions

1. Students are bound to obey the directions, issued from time to time, by the Principal, teachers and the authorities. Disobedience to such directions would amount to serious misconduct and will invite disciplinary action.

- 2. Any student, who is found to have conducted himself/herself in any indecent or disorderly manner inside or outside the class room or in and around the college premises, is liable to be proceeded against for the said misconduct.
- 3. A teacher may send a student out of the class if the student misbehaves in the class and the matter will be reported to the authorities for punitive actions.
- 4. The Principal shall have the power to inflict the following punishments upon the offenders: fine, cancellation of attendance, withholding the term certificate, forfeiting education concession and scholarship, suspension, compulsory issue of T.C. without the application from the student or guardian, and expulsion.

### Disciplinary procedure:

Normally any act of indiscipline shall be reported to the respective class tutors by a student, a teacher, or any person inside or outside the institution. On receipt of the complaint, the matter will be discussed in the department level committee and necessary action may be Taken. In cases where the matter is not concluded in  $\mathbf{1}^{st}$  level the same may be forwarded to the disciplinary committee headed by the principal will take the appropriate decision. Governing Council will be the appeal authority and the decision of the Governing Council shall be final on all such matters.

### K. Rules Regarding Malpractices in Examinations

Malpractices in the examinations are punishable. The following action will be taken against the students who indulge in malpractice.

- Bringing any material relevant to the examination with the intention of copying or attaching unauthorised sheets in the answer script or tampering the answer sheets or copying from other students' answer scripts will initiate disciplinary action which will lead to the cancellation of the whole semester and debarment for maximum of three chances based on the enquiry report.
- 2. Using filthy language in the answer script will lead to cancellation of the concerned paper.
- 3. Manhandling or threatening the invigilator or any other official or impersonation will initiate permanent debarring and the matter will be reported to the police.
- 4. Helping others to answer questions in the examination hall will result in the student being debarred for two to four chances.
- 5. Tampering the answer scripts of other students will result in debarment for six chances or permanent debarment or reporting to the Police.
- 6. Disturbing a candidate from outside or inside the examination hall will result in the cancellation of registration of the student or debarment for two chances.

- 7. Shouting answers from outside / inside the examination hall will result in the cancellation of registration of the student or debarment for two chances and / or reporting to the police.
- 8. Stealing answer sheets or additional sheets or question papers or examination-related objects/documents will result in the cancellation of Registration of the student or debarring for two to four chances and/or reporting to the police.
- 9. Purposefully changing the seating arrangement in the examination hall and sitting in the wrong seat will result in debarment for one chance.

### L. Fee Regulations

- 1 Tuition fee for all Courses should be paid in lump sum at the beginning of the semester / academic year.
- 2. The fee must be paid on the dates prescribed in the notification from time to time. If any student fails to pay the fees or special fees on the due date, he shall be liable to pay a fine of ₹ 50/- along with the fees, if the payment is made within 10 days of the due date and thereafter an additional fine of ₹ 100/-. If the 10<sup>th</sup> day happens to be public holiday, the next working day will be counted as the 10<sup>th</sup> day. ₹ 500/- will be imposed as re admission fee from those who fail to remit the tuition fees even after the allowed date of remittance of fees with fine.
- 3. If the fees and fine of an installment are not paid before the last date given for payment of that installment, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the College with effect from the date following the expiry of the period and the student will not get the benefit of attendance from the date of removal from the rolls of the College. If the student is to be re admitted he/she has to apply for the special permission of the Principal and also has to remit all the arrears of fees with fine. The re-admitted students will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of re-admission.
- 4. Every student is liable to pay the prescribed fee for the whole term.
- 5. Fees shall be paid on the dates notified even if discontinues. All cash transactions will be closed at 3.30 p.m. every day.
- 6. The student shall preserve receipts of fee payments and produce them whenever required by the principal.
