## **ANNUAL REPORT 2021-22**

The times have changed and we were on the path of change to face the epidemic. We have developed ourselves and made an impact in our curriculum as a whole. We have empowered ourselves with updating technology into our academic performance and supported the faculty in delivering their best while assisting the student in their performance in curriculum.

The academic year commenced with an online mode of operation, where teaching and non-teaching staff participated in various orientation programs specifically designed to enhance their expertise in online teaching methodologies and online file management. The various UG and PG programs welcomed a total of 849 students to the college. To facilitate the smooth transition of newcomers, each department organized an orientation program called "Deeksharambh." We had our NAAC peer team visit on November 22nd and 23rd and received an A grade (3.25 CGPA) accreditation in the 4th Cycle.

As a result of the inclusion of the new course, B. Voc. Broadcasting and Journalism, the total number of undergraduate (UG) programs has reached 16. Additionally, the institution offered 9 Add-on/Certificate programs. Out of the total number of students, 259 students enrolled in Certificate/Add-on programs.

During the academic year 2021-22, we made significant additions to our infrastructure to enhance the overall student experience. We introduced a range of new facilities aimed at providing numerous benefits to our students. These additions include an open gymnasium, a dedicated recording studio, the installation of smart boards in nearly all classrooms, the implementation of a lift facility, and the renovation of our digital library. The expenditure for maintaining infrastructure, including physical and academic support facilities, amounted to INR 368.05 lakhs during the year.

## Lift facility

Next, we move onto the details of the research activities during the year. The institution received grants totalling INR 16.76 lakhs from both government and non-governmental agencies for research projects. Two teachers awarded with PhD degrees in the academic year makes the total number of teachers with PhD degrees twenty three. Four teachers were registered for Ph.D. during the year 2021-22. Approval of three recognized research guides in the academic year makes the total number of research guides in the college seven. Six research papers and thirteen book chapters were published by faculties. The institution entered into 9 functional Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with institutions, universities and industries. There were 19 collaborative activities carried out for research, faculty exchange, and student exchange/internship.

71 workshops/seminars were conducted on Research Methodology, Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), and entrepreneurship. Additionally, the institution conducted 5 extension and outreach programs through various departments and cells like NSS/NCC. Moreover, the institution received 5 awards and recognitions for its extension activities from government and government-recognized bodies.

In terms of university examinations, 374 final-year students successfully passed, out of a total of 648 students who appeared for the exams. Moreover, students from the institution participated in 98 sports and cultural events/competitions throughout the year. Finally, 30 awards/medals were received for outstanding performance in sports and cultural activities at the university, state, national, and international levels. Additionally, 41 students qualified in state, national, and international level examinations such as JAM, CLAT, NET, SLET, GATE, GMAT, CAT, GRE, TOEFL, Civil Services, and state government examinations. Furthermore, 667 students undertook project work, field work, or internships as part of their academic pursuits.

Regarding the placement and progression of the academic year, 109 outgoing students were successfully placed in various positions, and 267 outgoing students progressed to higher education.

1098 students benefited from scholarships and free ships provided by the Government and 182 students were provided scholarships via non-governmental institutions or agencies.

The alumni meet for the year 2021-22 took place on October 10th, 2021. Alumni members returned to their alma mater to renew their connection with the institution. Former students from various batches of the college congregated for the event, aiming to strengthen their ties with the institution and contribute to the college's progress and growth.

## Clubs & Cells activities

#### **National Service Scheme (NSS)**

The NSS (National Service Scheme) plays a significant role in conducting several key programs. NSS used to observe Day Observations like Independence day, Republic day, world environment day, International Yoga Day, World Nature Conservation Day etc., Competitions among students like poster making competition, photography competition, debate competition etc. quizzes, awareness campaigns, social outreach programs like distributing Onam kits to impoverished families, distributing food packets to needy ones. NSS unit conducted a free covid-19 vaccination drive on 3rd September 2021. The students of NSS unit volunteered at 'Niyukthi 2021' Mega Job Fair on 11 December 2021 conducted in St. Paul's college Kalamassery. Around 10893 employees have attended this job fair. NSS unit also organized a seven-day camp in December 2021 named "Karuthal".

## **National Cadet Corps (NCC)**

NCC unit of the college ensures training its cadets for instilling patriotism to the country. NCC regularly organizes awareness programmes and cleanliness drives. Some of the important programmes conducted during the academic year 2021-22 includes Fit India Freedom Run, Vijay Diwas commemoration, Anti-Tobacco day celebration, Naval Marathon Reception etc.

## **Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC)**

The Equal Opportunity Cell in association with the Department of Physical Education organized "Meet and Interact with Bentla D'Couth, the Olympian of St. Paul's College" on 23 June 20201. Ms.Bentla D'Couth is a former Indian football player who represented India in Asian Games in 2002 and 2006 and in all Asian championships starting from 2001 to 2009.

## Women's Development Cell (WDC)

The Women Empowerment Cell organized an online quiz NATURE NURTURE 2021 on Women Environmentalists as part of the World Environment Day. The quiz was designed by Lima Sunny, the coordinator of the Cell and was accessed through the eLearning platform of the college that was open from 4th June 5.00 pm till 7th June 5.00pm. There were 77 entries and the total points were 20. Certificates were issued to all participants. Several participants both student and faculty, scored 100%.

## **Mentoring Cell**

A general meeting of the mentoring cell and IQAC of the college was held in the first week of June and decisions were taken regarding the conduct of mentoring sessions. A mentoring circular is distributed in which each head of the department has to assign teachers as mentors of about 20-25 students of the department and provide mentoring sessions for them. Through these mentoring sessions the teacher has to help the students in both academic and non academic matters.

## **Counselling Cell**

The cell works in association with the various departments of the college. Each department has one teacher coordinator and two student coordinators from each class. They were assigned to identify the needy students and provide counseling sessions in the department itself. If the student requires more support and care, they will be directed to the cell and the cell provides counseling sessions for them.

#### **Career Guidance and Placement cell**

The cell coordinated a range of activities aimed at enhancing students' soft skills and communication abilities. Among the programs offered were "Skill Profiling for a Promising Future" held on July 19, 2021, "Effective Job Interview Techniques" organized on December 20, 2021, and "Nurturing Soft Skills" conducted on August 18, 2021. These initiatives played a vital role in honing the students' interpersonal and communication skills.

## **Entrepreneurship Development Cell and Placement Cell**

The IEDC organized a series of lectures titled the "Impact Lecture Series" in October 2021, providing valuable insights and knowledge to the participants from various departments. In collaboration with the Department of English (SF) and the Office of Training and Development, the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Cell (IEDC) of St. Paul's College Kalamassery organized a thought-provoking session titled "Doodle Workshop."Furthermore, in association with St. Albert's College Ernakulam and IEDC, the Department of Business Studies at St. Paul's College Kalamassery organized World Entrepreneurship Day on August 17, 2021. This event served as a platform for students and faculty to understand the importance of entrepreneurship in academic settings and motivated them to generate business ideas.

#### **Encon Club**

## **Pauline Support:**




## **Student Teacher Programme:**
