Annual Report 2022 - 2023

After a few years that reflected the aftermath of the epidemic, this academic year witnessed a smooth functioning and full swing run of the college. We have equipped ourselves to adapt to the changing educational scenario and developments in the field of higher education. We have empowered ourselves with updating technology into our academic performance and supported the faculty in delivering their best while assisting the student in their academic performance. The various UG and PG programs welcomed a total of 849 students to the college. To facilitate the smooth transition of newcomers, each department organized an orientation programme 'Deekshaarambh' which had two sessions; one, a central session and the other department wise. Centralized programme saw the students being addressed by the Manager, Director, Principal and popular motivational speakers Dr Mary Matilda and Mr Vipin P Roldant. An induction programme was also organised for the faculty members in the beginning of the academic year. Apart from their regular activities, this year we could organize a workshop for the administrative staff of various institutions in association with the DyDCE, Ernakulam.

On the research front, 5 of our teachers -Mr Binil Kumar M. R., Ms. Lima Sunny and Ms.Sreelakshmi J. from the English Department, Mr Shiju C.R from the Commerce Department and Ms. Mary Vijila from the Physics Department received their Doctorate degrees this year. Dr Rajeshmon V. G and Dr Poornima N from the Physics Department and Dr Tresa Sunita George from the Chemistry Department were recognized as Research Guides by Mahatma Gandhi University. Our faculty also showed keen interest in publishing their findings in various national and international journals during this academic year, giving an output of more than 30 publications. Our faculty Dr Asha E Thomas bagged an ICSSR Major Project and its indeed a great prestige. During the academic year 2022-2023, our College signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with International Skill Development Corporation (ISDC).

National Cadet Corps (NCC)



The goal of the workshop was to give participants stress-reduction and self-defense techniques.



Mentoring Cell & Counselling Cell

Mentorship programs involve faculty members guiding students in academic and career paths, offering advice and motivation to foster focus and diligence, with each mentor catering to 15-25 mentees based on departmental needs. Additionally, self-exploration workshops facilitate student exploration of interests, strengths, and areas for improvement, covering topics like self-awareness and time management through the value education cell. Literary Club






Quiz Club
