


### **About the College**

The intersection of technologies with Cultural Studies and to cybermodernism Humanities has led postmodernism and the digital age. Cybermodernism incorporates identity, reality, and techno-integration themes, exhibited through cutting-edge, radical narrative forms and avant-garde digital aesthetics. Cybermodern literature reflects the reconfigured human experience and expressions in an overwhelmingly connected and technodriven world. The dissolution of boundaries between the real and the virtual has led to fragmented and hyperreal identities, as well as cyborg and posthuman themes pushing the borders beyond the traditional into cybermediated spaces.

Cybermodernism shares postmodernism's scepticism of grand narratives and fixed truths and directly engages with technology and cyberspace, reflecting the cultural and philosophical shifts brought about by cybernetic advancements. Themes may encapsulate the tensions of posthuman identity questioning the essence of humanity, autonomous creativity and decentralised authorship and ethical concerns in a cyber-controlled human environment.

The proposed seminar, "Cybermodernism and Culture: Digital Humanities in Theory, Praxis and Pedagogy," aims to explore the theoretical underpinnings, practical applications, and pedagogical strategies of Digital Humanities, focusing on the implications of Cybermodernism.


