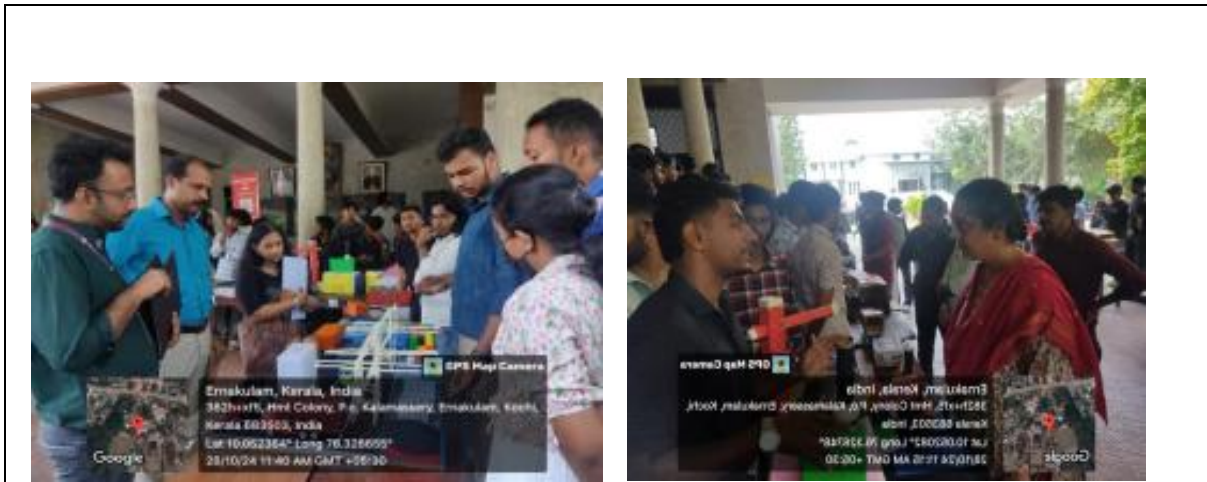

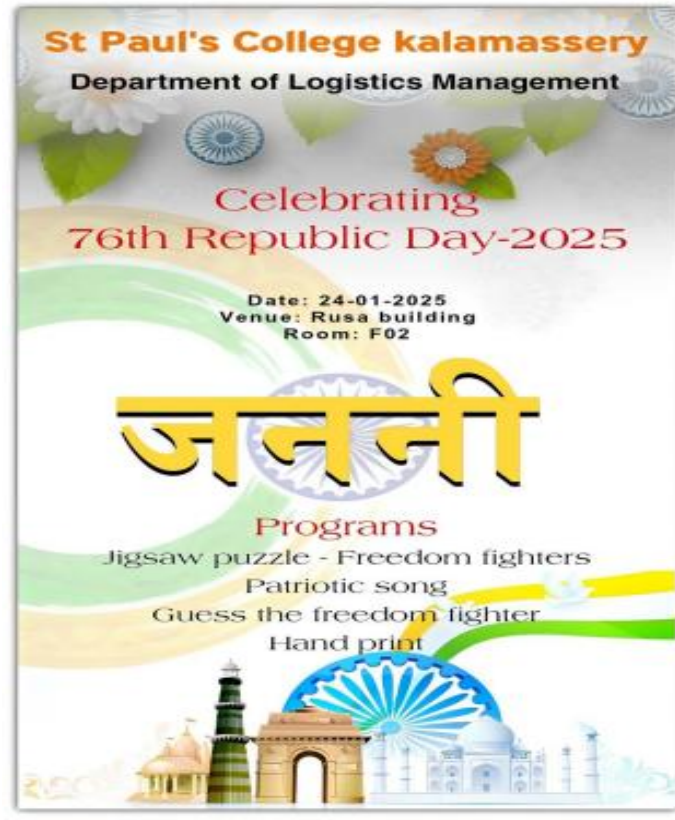
Conversation about road Safety – In connection with National Road safety.
