Two-Day Investment Awareness Workshop in Association with NISM

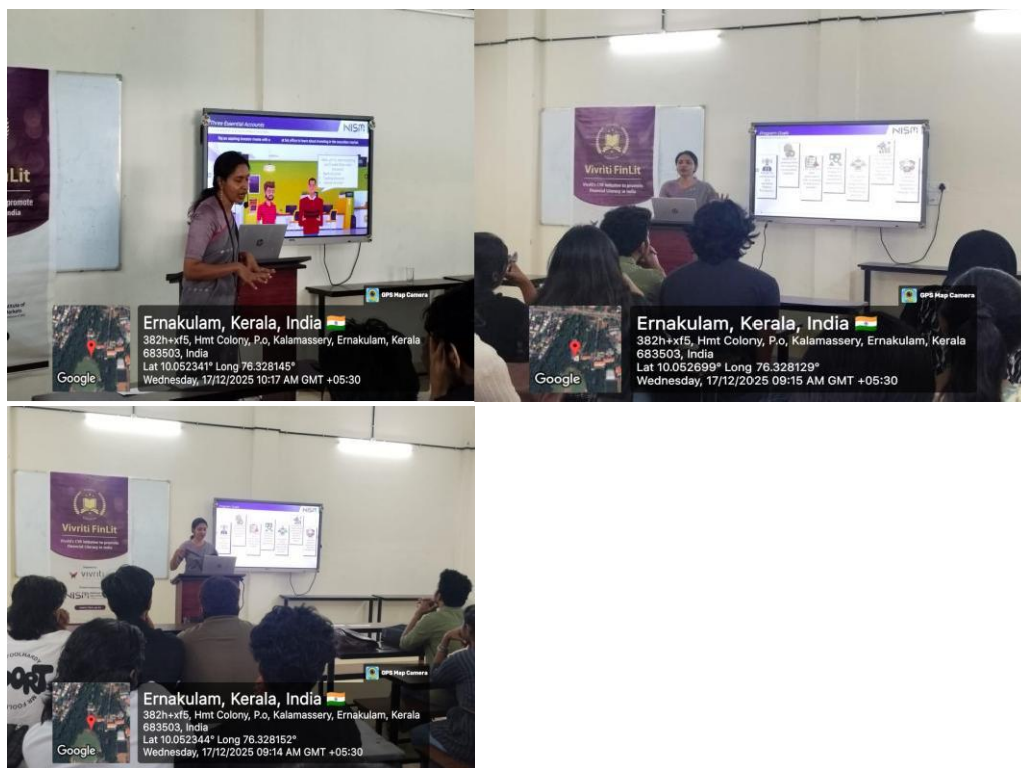

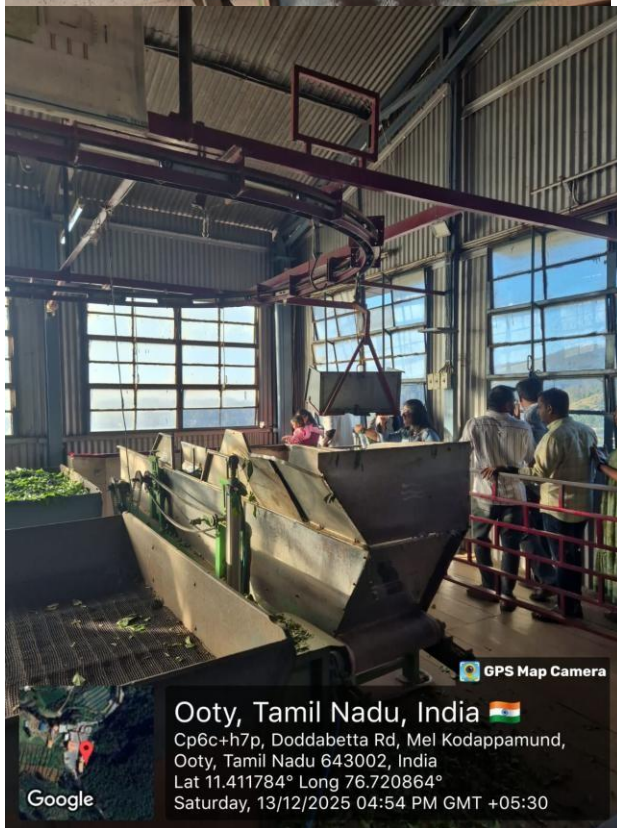
REPORT ON INDUSTRIAL VISIT
